RICHWOODS CEMETERY - BLUFFDALE TOWNSHIP - GREENE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Located 6 miles west of Carrollton, in the southeast corner of section 11, township 10 north, range 13 west - Bluffdale township, Greene County, III.

This is not just a list of tombstone readings. It is a list of the known burials in the cemetery and some information concerning them. This cemetery has been known as the Simpson Cemetery, and in the obituary of Aaron Flatt it is referred to as the Carrico Graveyard. This is not complete and in most cases only parts of obituaries pertaining to genealogy material is included. It should be used as a guide for further research.

Newspaper unknown - Gottlieb C. Byland died at his home six miles west of Carrollton, January 24, 1914, aged 67 years and 21 days. Gottlieb C. Byland was born in Veltheim, Switzerland, Jan. 3, 1847, and came to Carrollton the summer of 1871. He married to Miss Lisette Simmen Aug. 27, 1871. He leaves surviving him, his wife and three sons, John R. of Chicago, Henry G. and Frank P. of Greene county and eight grandchildren. He has two sons dead. He was the last surviving member of a family of seven children. After his death in 1924, she resided at the home of her son, Henry. Three sons survive, John of Chicago, Henry of Richmond Heights and Frank of Carrollton. There were also ten grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Note, The husband of Lisette, died Jan. 24, 1914 and is reported in The Carrollton Patriot, Jan. 29, 1914.
