Jesse McCracken with wife and 2 daughters under the age of 5 years old are found in the 1830 census of Wayne County, Illinois. He died before March 1832. Letters of administration of his estate were issued in March of 1832 in Wayne County. Rachel married for the 2nd time to Russell Curry about 1834 probably in Wayne County, Ill. In 1840 census of Greene County, Rachel Curry is shown as head of the household with 6 children. No mention of Russell, so he apparently died. No record of a divorce found. Those 6 children were; Mildred McCracken who married Samuel W. Decker and had at least 2 children, James & Alice. She died Jan. 18, 1868 and is buried in the Camerer cemetery. - Mahulda Jane McCracken who married David Flatt - George W.
